What are the benefits of Degree Partnership?

- Lower tuition costs
- Easier transition from community college to university
- Coordinated financial aid for qualified students
- Four-year school advisors available at both campuses
- Flexible scheduling with more course options
- Access to student services, college facilities and campus activities at both institutions

Where do I apply?

What are the requirements for admission?

- Depending on the number of credits you have completed at CCC, you may need to meet the freshman or transfer student admissions requirements. For more details, please visit:

How do I know if I've been accepted?

- You will be notified of your acceptance from each institution.

I've been accepted. Now what?

- In your acceptance letter, you will be notified of next steps.
- Students will want to attend an orientation session at [OIT](#), [OSU](#) or [PSU](#) prior to registering for credits through the 4-year school.
- CCC offers [New Student Advising Sessions](#) for students new to college. If you are transferring to CCC from another institution, you will want to speak with an [advisor](#).

How do I know what course to take?

- You will work with advisors from each school to ensure the smoothest transition.
- Students new to CCC will meet with an advisor to select first term courses.
 - Students new to college do this through [New Student Advising Sessions](#).
 - Students who are transferring from other colleges should meet with an [advisor](#).

How do I register for courses?

- You will register for courses online.

- You will need to register for courses through each school's online registration system. At orientation, you will learn more about how to do this.
- To register for CCC courses, log into [myClackamas](#).

How do I find my grades?

- You can find your grades online at the end of each term. Courses taken through CCC, will be on [myClackamas](#). Courses taken at other schools will be found on their online system.

Will courses from both schools be on one transcript?

- No. Only the courses you take at each institution will be listed. Therefore, be certain to tell your advisor what you are taking at each school.

Where do I buy my books?

How much do I pay and who do I pay?

- Courses taken through CCC will be billed the CCC tuition rate plus appropriate fees.
- Courses taken through OSU, PSU, or OIT will be billed at that institution's rate. The first term that a student takes courses at the 4-year school, they will be charged a matriculation fee. Please see the 4-year school's website for additional information.
- You will receive a bill and need to pay each institution separately.

Where do I get my financial aid?

- If you receive financial aid, the aid will be awarded at your home school, and any remaining balance will come to you in a check, which you can use to pay your tuition at the other school.

Who is my home school?

- The student cannot have financial aid that pays out from more than one institution. The "home" institution (the college that pays the financial aid) shall be determined by the student's immediate degree objective. For example, if the student's immediate degree objective is a bachelor's degree, then OIT will be designated as the "home" institution. Should the student be pursuing either an Associate of Arts or Science degree prior to completing a bachelor's degree,

Clackamas Community College will be designated as the “home” institution. Once a student has earned an AAS or AAOT, then OIT will be the home institution.

- Students must be registered for a minimum number of credits at the school which is providing their financial aid. Please consult each school for details.

Does my financial aid automatically pay the other school?

- No. You will be refunded money from your home school, which you can use to pay the other.
