## **Periodicals: Research, News, Hot Topics & Features**

**Journals:** formal, peer-reviewed articles in which researchers report their new work

**Trade journals:** news, features and career information for professionals in a field

**Magazines:** news and features for non-specialists or the general public

Over 100 anthropology-related titles are also available full-text via *Academic Search Premier* (EBSCO). Magazine websites (try a Google search) may provide article summaries, a few featured articles, and/or added features such as audio/video clips and links to further information.

**Article Indexes** (Access: Research Gateway >> Article Indexes; ask for passwords to use these from home)

*Academic Search Premier* (EBSCO) - all-purpose index for undergraduate research, lots of full-text

- Use **and, or & truncation (\*)** as needed – EBSCO defaults to a **phrase** search (unlike *Google*).  
line 1: *human evolution or hominid\** [and] line 2: *brain\**
- Using the **Subjects** tab to browse subject headings often gives more precise results.
- Use **Refine Search** to limit to items in **full text** or **held at CCC**; items >1 page long

**NewsBank: Oregonian** and *Newsfile* (full text articles from over 500 U.S. newspapers)

Be skeptical, and evaluate the credibility of the information using the **same criteria** (author's credentials, publisher's reputation, writing style and accuracy, references cited...) you would with print material.
