Article Indexes

(obtain passwords at the Reference Desk to use these products off-campus)

Academic Search Premier (EBSCO) Indexes > 6000 periodicals; all subjects; many **full-text** articles.

CINAHL (Cumulative Index to Nursing and Allied Health Literature; EBSCO)

Indexes 1600 publications, including 500 nursing journals; limited full text.

Health Source: Nursing / Academic Edition (EBSCO; CCC subscription)

500 publications in nursing, medicine and allied health; many full-text articles

MEDLINE (EBSCO; also free to public at "PubMed": www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/PubMed)

Free government index of medical and nursing journals; abstracts only.
