Click the title and follow the “Read this book now” link to open the book.

To search for e-books only: use **Advanced Keyword**; open the **Material Type** menu; select **E-books**.

Our NetLibrary Collection (Research Gateway >> Find eBooks >> NetLibrary)

- > 5,000 **current**, academic titles purchased by CCC Library – these also appear in our catalog
- > 3,000 additional **public domain** (out-of-copyright) titles (these do *not* appear in our catalog)
- **“Reference Center”** – search hundreds of academic encyclopedias for entries on your topic.

To access our NetLibrary e-books off-campus, **create an account** (free) from any CCC computer.
 (If you create your account at home, *NetLibrary* will show you only public domain collection.)

To **exclude the public domain titles** from your search:

Go to “Edit My Account.” In “Account preferences” *uncheck* “Publicly Accessible Collection.”

Search statements:

shakespeare criticism

feminis*

“climate change”

“climate change” OR “global warming”

(NOTE: NetLibrary defaults to a **full-text** search; try keyword instead!)

finds items with both words

retrieves *feminism, feminist, feminists...*

retrieves exact phrase *climate change*

retrieves items with either term

Viewing Some books are in plain html format; most are in pdf (Adobe Acrobat) format:

Write **notes**

(40 notes per book, 500 characters per note)

Use **Acrobat Tools** to **select & copy** text or **print** a page.

Use the **lens icon** to magnify text.

Browse the **table of contents**

Or **search** the book for a word(s).

ADDITIONAL E-BOOK RESOURCES

Google Books (books.google.com)

Google is currently engaged in massive digitization projects intended to “create a comprehensive, searchable, virtual card catalog of all books in all languages.”

Depending on copyright / permissions status, you may be able to see:

- Full View – entire text may be searched and viewed.
- Limited Preview – only certain pages (often the first few pages of each chapter) may be viewed.
- Snippet View – a few sentences surrounding the first few occurrences of your search term
- No Preview – information *about* the book only

In any book record, choose **Find this Book in a Library** for a list of libraries with the item, near to far.

Use the **Advanced Search** screen to limit to particular dates, or see full-view items only.
