

Need a book we don't have? Try SUMMIT (orbis.uoregon.edu) to identify items; request an Interlibrary Loan.

2. E-Books:

NetLibrary: CCC Library subscribes to > 1,000 current, academic e-books from *NetLibrary* (www.netlibrary.com). Access items through *CougarCat* (they show “**e-book**” in the call number) or directly from *NetLibrary*. Home access available once you have signed up on a CCC computer.

Freebies: Many out-of-copyright and self-published books are posted on the Web – including many works of classical mythology. Our website links to some major providers - choose **Research Gateway >> E-Texts on the Web**



Periodicals: Research, News, Hot Topics & Features

Journals: formal, peer-reviewed articles in which researchers report their new work

Magazines: news and features for non-specialists or the general public

Article Indexes (Research Gateway>Find Articles, or drop-down menu; ask for passwords to use from home)

Academic Search Premier (EBSCO) - all-purpose index for undergraduate research, extensive full-text

Try the **Subject Terms** tab to browse subject headings for more precise results.

Use **Refine Search** to limit to items available in **full text** or held at CCC; or to scholarly (**peer-reviewed**) items.

Additional indexes via Multnomah County Library website, for users with a Multnomah County Library card:

Humanities Index – citations (no full text) to articles from several hundred source journals in the humanities.

MLA Bibliography – comprehensive index (citations only) for the serious researcher in language and literature.

Obtaining Articles

Owned at CCC:

Alphabetical by journal title in the **Periodicals** section.

Our **Periodicals List** is on the website and in red notebooks in the Library.

Not owned at CCC:

Request an article **Interlibrary Loan** (form at Circulation Desk), or

Check **SUMMIT** (=“ORBIS”) catalog for other area libraries that own the title

REMEMBER: Information available on the Web is information that people are willing to *give away*. Be skeptical, and evaluate the credibility of the information using the *same criteria* (author's credentials, publisher's reputation, writing style and accuracy, references cited...) you would with print material.
